

Clean Sweep will happen Saturday, June 28  
Volunteers, food, and junk needed

Corcoran's annual Clean Sweep event will happen on Saturday, June 28 this year, and volunteers and food are needed! The annual Clean Sweep community event helps Corcoran residents dispose of non-hazardous junk that cannot be reused, sold, or given away. The materials should be left at the alley and marked clearly. Clean Sweep volunteers load these materials into trucks and haul them to the Southside Transfer Station.

Please put your items out the night before the event. The following items are okay to leave:

- Construction debris such as drywall, plaster, shingles, or wood.
- Scrap pieces of concrete, asphalt, brick, or rock.
- Tires.
- Scrap metal.

Do not leave these items for Clean Sweep:

- Hazardous items such as left-over adhesives, fuels, paint, batteries, or fluorescent bulbs. Bring these to the free Hennepin County drop-off site at 1400 W. 96th St. in Bloomington. Call 348-3777 to learn more.
- Electronics such as radios, computers, or TVs. Bring them to the free Hennepin County site.
- Motor oil or filters. Several nearby locations accept these for free. Call 673-2917 to find a location.
- Yard waste. The City takes brush, leaves, and grass clippings on garbage day through mid-November. Call 673-2917 to learn more.
- Appliances or furniture. The City takes appliances and large items on garbage day. Mark them "for Solid Waste." Call 673-2917 to learn more.

Volunteers and food are needed for Clean Sweep:

- Volunteers have a great time throwing around junk, serving the community, and meeting new people. Loading is physical work. Wear closed-toed shoes, long sleeves, and pants instead of shorts. We start at 8:00 am and try to finish by 3:00. We'll provide breakfast and lunch.
- We also need an event receptionist to answer phones, we need food servers, and we need drivers.
- We need food and beverages to feed our hungry volunteers! Can you help us out?

Their Deconstruction Services can help you disassemble large-scale donations such as kitchen cabinetry. Request a receipt for the fair market value of your donation, for use at tax time.
